



DINOSAUR FOOTPRINT COOKIES

SERVINGS: 48 COOKIES

PREP TIME: 2 HRS 10 MIN

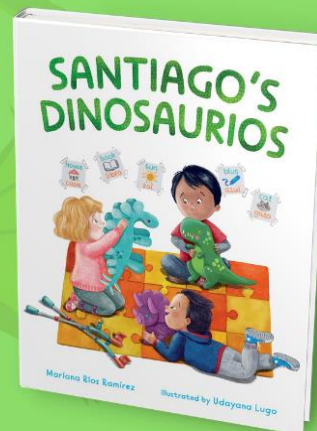
COOK TIME: 10 MIN

INGREDIENTS

- 1 cup Unsalted Butter, softened to room temp
- 1 cup Granulated Sugar
- 1 Egg
- 1 tbsp Vanilla Extract
- 3 cups Flour
- 1 1/2 tsp Baking Powder
- 1/2 tsp Salt

DIRECTIONS

1. In a large bowl or stand mixer, cream butter and sugar on high until light and fluffy.
2. Add egg and vanilla and beat until well combined.
3. In a separate bowl, sift together flour, baking powder, and salt.
4. Slowly add the flour mixture to the butter mixture, lightly mixing between each addition until flour is completely incorporated.
5. Roll into a ball, wrap in cling wrap and chill for 1-2 hours.
6. Preheat oven to 350 F and line baking sheet with parchment paper.
7. Roll dough out evenly with a lightly floured roller onto a lightly floured flat surface until it's a 1/4 inch thick.
8. Use round cookie cutters to cut out cookies.
9. Use the foot of the dinosaur toy to make a footprint in the cookies.
10. Transfer to baking sheet and bake for 8-10 minutes, just until edges begin to brown.
